Rule 18 - 2 (Ball at Rest Moved)

(R & A Decisions on the Rules of Golf 2010 – 2011)

NOTE: These examples ONLY deal with a teed ball (Practice Swing) and ball moved accidently by Practice Swing other than on the tee.

18-2a/19 BALL MOVED ACIDENTLY BY PRACTICE SWING PRIOR TO TEE SHOT

- Q: Before playing from the teeing ground, a player took a practice swing, in the course of which he accidently struck and moved the teed ball with his club. Did the player play a stroke or incur a penalty?
- A: The player did <u>not make</u> a stroke see Definition of "Stroke". Since the ball was <u>not in play</u> see definition of "Ball in Play" he incurred no penalty under Rule 18-2a. The player must put a ball into play from the teeing ground.

18-2a/20 - BALL IN PLAY MOVED ACCIDENTLY BY PRACTICE SWING

- Q: A player makes a practice swing and accidently moves his ball in play with his club. Has he made a stroke?
- A: **NO**. He had no intention of moving the ball see definition of "Stroke". However, he <u>incurs a penalty stroke</u> under Rule 18-2a for moving his ball in play, and the <u>ball must be replaced.</u>
